TONIGHT'S GAME OVERVIEW

The quest for the Calder Cup continues tonight as the Rochester Americans host the AHL regular-season champion Laval Rocket in Game 1 of the North Division Finals at The Blue Cross Arena. Game time is slated for a 7:05 p.m. start and will be carried live on The Sports Leader 95.7 FM/950 AM The Fan Rochester as well as AHLTV. The best-of-five series starts in Rochester before shifting to Place Bell next week north of the border.

SERIES NOTES

After falling into a 2-0 deficit early in Game 1 of the opening round against Syracuse, the Amerks haven't allowed a goal against since, scoring 11 straight goals to close out the series by outscoring the Crunch 11-2.

Amerks defenseman **Kale Clague**, who entered the postseason having appeared in only one career playoff contest, has goals in three straight games with all coming in the third period. Clague is tied for first in playoff scoring amongst defensemen and tied for second overall with five points (3+2) through his first three games of the 2025 postseason.

After leading all netminders during the regular season with seven shutouts, goaltender **Devon Levi** added two more perfect performances to his list of achievements this season by combining for 65 saves while backstopping the Amerks to a pair of 4-0 victories to close out the Crunch.

Levi, who hasn't allowed a goal in 156:31 of action, became just the third goaltender in franchise history to record shutouts in back-to-back playoff games and the first in 25 years since Mika Noronen did it twice during the 2000 postseason. Including the regular season, Levi now has an astounding nine shutouts over his last 41 games.

AMERKS MEET ROCKET IN DIVISION FINALS

For the second time in four years, the Rochester Americans will meet the Rocket in the North Division Finals of the 2025 Calder Cup Playoffs.

The Amerks completed a sweep of the Syracuse Crunch with a 4-0 win in Game 3 of the North Division Semifinals on May 1 while the Rocket closed out their second-round series by way of a 4-1 win over the Cleveland Monsters five days later on May 6 at Place Bell.

The Rocket, who won the Macgregor Kilpatrick Trophy as this year's AHL regular-season champions, defeated the Amerks three games to none in the 2022 North Division Finals in the only other postseason meeting between the two teams.

Rochester is 29-19-0 all-time against Laval in the regular season, which included an 8-7-1-0 mark over the last two seasons versus the Rocket. Rochester has picked up at least one point in 16 of its first 24 road games in Laval, going 14-8-2-0 over that span. Conversely, since the start of the 2017-18 campaign, the Amerks have posted a 15-8-2-0 mark at The Blue Cross Arena versus Laval, including all four meetings last season.

The Amerks have outshot the Rocket eight times over the last 16 games since the start of the 2023-24 campaign.

PLAYOFFS OVER THE YEARS

Rochester has advanced to the postseason in each of the last six seasons dating back to the 2017-18 campaign and 50 times in the 69-year history of the franchise.

Rochester has been a part of 92 playoff series over the years, in which it has compiled a 230-219 record in 449 games during that time.

HEAD-TO-HEAD SERIES SNAPSHOT

The Rocket finished nine points ahead of the second-place Amerks in the regular season, thanks largely to a 6-1-1-0 record in their eight head-to-head meetings. Laval won all four visits to Blue Cross Arena by a combined score of 16-7.

Prior to this season, Rochester has never had a losing season versus the Rocket and have gone 4-3-1-0 in back-to-back seasons. The Amerks posted a 6-2-0-0 mark in eight games during the 2023-24 campaign before going 2-5-1-0 through the eight games this season, with both wins coming in Place Bell back on Nov. 20 and Dec. 11.

The Amerks scored nine of their 16 goals against the Rocket in the second period whereas Laval totaled 13 of its 24 tallies after the conclusion of the middle stanza. Additionally, Rochester outshot the Rocket in the first (75-58), second (104-68) and overtime (5-3) periods during the regular season, but Laval finished with slim 70-68 shot-advantage.

Throughout his career, Amerks captain **Mason Jobst** has amassed nine goals and 10 assists for 19 points through 25 career regular-season games against Laval. The Ohio State University product, who collected the first multi-goal outing of his postseason career during Rochester's 4-0 win in Game 3 at Syracuse, has recorded 18 points (6+12) in 22 Calder Cup Playoff appearances. Jobst also tallied his second pro hat trick against Laval back on Oct. 27, 2023 while **Kale Clague** (0+3) and **Lukáš Rousek** (1+1) both notched multi-point efforts.

Forward **Jiří Kulich** has nearly produced a point-per-game in the regular season against the Rocket, which included his first career three-goal outing versus Laval on Oct. 18, 2023. The Czechia native has eight goals and seven assists in 15 contests opposite the Rocket since the start of the 2023-24 season

Goaltender and Quebec native **Devon Levi** has made seven career starts against Laval, earning a win in three appearances. In his first three contests versus the Rocket, Levi allowed just three combined goals and went 3-0-0 before allowing 14 tallies in the his last four games.

Both teams showed near-perfect records when leading after the first period: Rochester went 24-5-1-1 while Laval held 25-4-0-0 in that regard. Additionally, the Amerks were 31-4-2-1 when they held the lead entering the final period of regulation whereas the Rocket went 29-3-0-1. Lastly, they also have posted double digits in wins (ROC-15) (LAV-10) in three-goal games.

A SWEDE FIRST SEASON FOR ÖSTLUND

Noah Östlund was among Rochester's top point-producers in the month of February and March. The first-year forward finished his rookie season tallying 19 goals and 36 points on the season, with 27 of his points (16+11) coming since Feb. 1. He also found the back of the net in six of his last seven games, a streak that began with his first AHL hat trick on March 22 at Syracuse.

Östlund, who was named the Player of the Week for the period ending March 30, was also named the league's Rookie of the Month for March as he recorded nine goals and five assists for 14 points in 11 games for Rochester.

A first-round choice (16th overall) by Buffalo in the 2022 NHL Draft, Östlund totaled 19 goals and 17 assists for 36 points in 45 games with the Amerks this season. The 21-year-old native of Stockholm, Sweden, was second amongst all AHL rookies in plus/minus rating at plus-20, and his 15 goals since the All-Star break were fourth-most in the entire league.

Östlund's success earned the rookie forward his first-ever call-up to the Sabres. He made his NHL debut at home against Tampa Bay on April 5. He became the second Amerks forward this season to make his NHL debut with the Sabres, joining **Tyson Kozak**, who had five points in 21 appearances with the big club since making his debut Dec. 5. Östlund appeared in eight games with the Sabres, registering four shots while averaging 10:33 of ice time.

CENTURY MARK AND COUNTING

Brett Murray scored his 100th goal as an Amerk on April 16, becoming the 20th player in franchise history to reach triple-digit goal totals.

The Bolton, Ontario, native is one more goal away from matching former player and coach **Randy Cunneyworth** (101) on the franchise's all-time goals list, and needs two tallies to reach **Ken Priestley** (102) for 18th all-time in regular season goals for the Amerks.

Murray had a career season with a personal-best 27 goals, ranking second on the team behind only **Isak Rosén**. He was one of three Amerks named to this year's AHL All-Stars Classic.

Murray also matched his career-best of 49 points (23+26) from 2022-23. The sixth-year pro logged nine points (4+5) over his last 10 games.

Murray was one point away from joining **Rosén** to reach the 50-point mark. Prior to this season, Rochester had at least two players finish with 50 or more points in each season since the 2017-18 campaign excluding the COVID-shortened 2020-21 season.

In 35 career regular season games versus the Rocket, Murray has produced 16 points (7+9) along with 65 shots. The veteran forward also shows three points (2+1) in as many postseason contests against Laval.

Buffalo's fourth-round selection (99th overall) in the 2016 NHL Draft, the veteran forward has spent his entire six-year pro career in the Buffalo Sabres organization. In 325 career games as an Amerk, Murray has amassed 206 points on 100 goals and 106 assists while also adding 17 points (8+9) in 27 postseason appearances.

GETTING THE JOB(ST) DUNNE

Josh Dunne returns to the Calder Cup Playoffs after leading all Cleveland Monsters with seven goals and tying for second in points (11) during the 2024 postseason, which ended in Game 7 of the Eastern Conference Finals.

In Cleveland's three-game sweep against the Crunch in the Division Finals last spring, Dunne, who established a career-high 19 assists in 68 games with Rochester this season, scored one goal and notched an assist.

Captain **Mason Jobst** finished the 2024-25 campaign by reaching the 30-point mark for the third straight year. The Ohio State University product ranked fourth amongst Amerks in goals (18), sixth in points (37) and tied for seventh in assists (19) in 70 games.

Jobst totaled seven assists during his last trip to North Division Finals in the spring of 2023 against the Toronto Marlies. It marked his first multi-assist outing of his postseason career. The Speedway, Indiana, native has recorded 18 points (6+12) in 22 career AHL postseason contests.

LEONE AMONG ELITE COMPANY

By way of Rochester clinching a playoff spot, **Michael Leone** became the third straight bench boss to lead his team to the postseason in his first year as head coach, joining **Seth Appert** and **Chris Taylor**.

At age 37, Leone is the second-youngest active head coach in the AHL behind Trent Vogelhuber of the Cleveland Monsters, who were eliminated in the Division Semifinals against the Rocket.

Named the 34th head coach in the 69-year history of the franchise prior to the start of 2024-25, Leone embarked on his AHL head coaching career following two seasons as head coach and general manager of the Green Bay Gamblers (USHL).

With the Amerks finishing the season with 42 wins, Leone became the first head coach to reach the 40-win mark in his first season since Hall of Famer **Randy Cunneyworth** in 2000-01. Cunneyworth later went on to become the all-time winningest coach in franchise history with 340 career wins over nine seasons with Rochester.

SCOUTING THE ROCKET

The Laval Rocket secured the Macgregor Kilpatrick Trophy as the AHL's overall regular-season champions for the 2024-25 season as they posted a 48-19-3-2 record.

Guided by head coach Pascal Vincent, a Laval native who in his first season with the club won the Louis A.R. Pieri Memorial Award as the AHL's Coach of the Year, the Rocket finished with an AHL-best 48 wins and 101 points while also claiming second North Division title.

The Rocket are the first primary affiliate of the Montreal Canadiens to finish first overall in the AHL since the 1991-92 Fredericton Canadiens. (The Hamilton Bulldogs, a shared affiliate of the Canadiens and the Edmonton Oilers, won the Macgregor Kilpatrick Trophy in 2002-03.)

Vincent guided his hometown Rocket to a 27-point improvement over last season's Laval club. Vincent's club allowed 2.47 goals per game, tied for the fewest in the league, and he has been instrumental in the development of many young Canadiens prospects, including nine players who have competed with Montreal this season. Vincent, who also won the Louis A.R. Pieri Award in 2017-18, is the sixth two-time recipient of the award, joining Al MacNeil, Bob McCammon, Bill Dineen, Robbie Ftorek and Mitch Love, and the first to earn the honor with two different organizations.

Goaltenders Cayden Primeau and Connor Hughes were the co-recipients of the Harry "Hap" Holmes Memorial Award for the 2024-25 season. The Rocket allowed a league-low 178 goals in 2024-25, an average of 2.47 per game. This is the first Holmes Award for Laval and the first by a Montreal Canadiens affiliate since 2009-10.

Primeau joined the Rocket just after Christmas and was the AHL's most dominant goaltender over the second half of 2024-25. He posted the best single-season record in AHL history at 21-2-2 (.880) in 26 appearances, including wins in each of his first 10 decisions and an 11-0-2 streak to close out the regular season. The nephew of former Amerk Wayne Primeau, he also finished second in the league with a 1.96 goals-against average and third with a .927 save percentage. Hughes, in his first season in North America after seven years in Switzerland, went 15-12-2 in 29 appearances for the Rocket, registering a 2.58 goals-against average and .905 save percentage.
